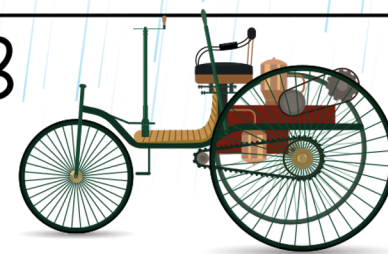
It's **Doctor's Day** in India! The day honours Dr Bidhan Chandra Roy, a famous physician from West Bengal.

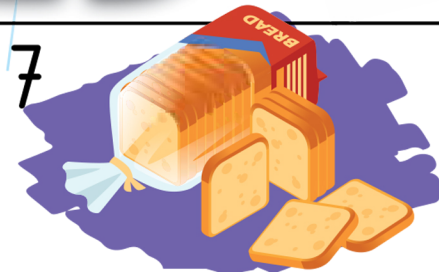
A group of flamingoes is called a flamboyance.

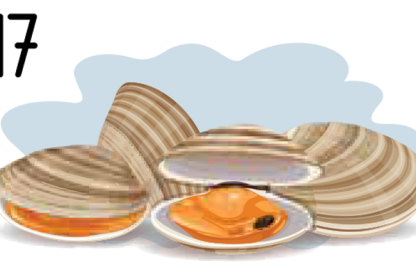
Snakes are nature's own pest-controllers, helping farmers by keeping rats and other pests in check.

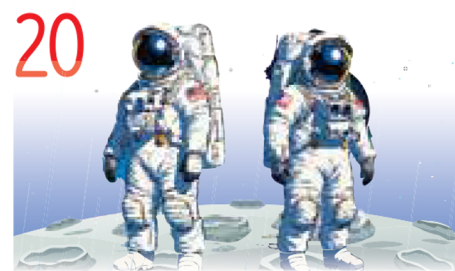
Honeybees communicate with each other through a special movement called the 'waggle dance'.

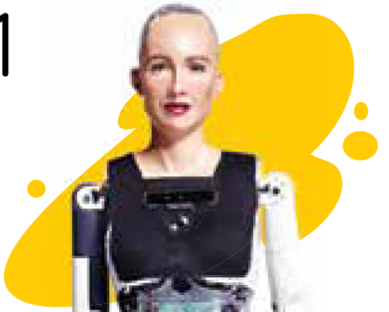
A sneeze can travel at speeds of up to 160kms/hr—that's even faster than a sprinting cheetah!

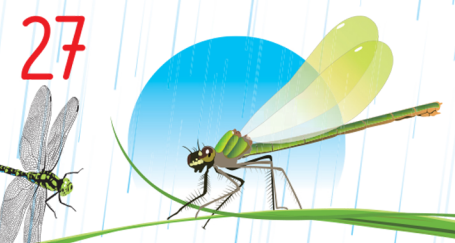
A single bolt of lightning is five times hotter than the surface of the sun!

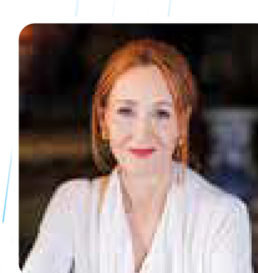
It's **International Tiger Day**! Did you know that a tiger can leap as far as 32.8ft in a single jump?
