8 **International Women's Day** was first celebrated in 1911. Did you know, the colour of Women's Day is purple, symbolising justice and dignity?



9 Kadambini Ganguly and Chandramukhi Basu were among the first Indian female graduates in the British Empire.



10 A cloud can weigh more than a million kilograms. Clouds float because their weight is spread across tiny droplets and rising air currents.



11 *Turritopsis dohrnii*, a jellyfish species, can reset its age, making it biologically immortal.



12 There are more stars in the universe than grains of sand on all of Earth's beaches. So far, scientists have counted 1 septillion stars and they are still counting!



13 Kolhapuri chillies are so spicy that they once caused export bans in Europe.



14 Saturn's rings are disappearing. NASA says they'll vanish in about 100 million years as gravity pulls them in.



15 Trees can talk to each other underground. They do this by sharing nutrients via fungal networks called mycorrhiza.



16 Believe it or not, a sneeze travels faster than a hurricane—over 160kms/hr!



17 In India, our forest guardians include Adivasi tribes such as Bhil, Gond and Khasi communities.



18 Chillies aren't naturally spicy to birds as they feel no heat from capsaicin—a plant strategy to spread seeds far.



19 **Ramzan Eid** is celebrated on the day when the new crescent moon of Shawwāl (10th month in the Islamic calendar) is seen.



20 Today is **World Sparrow Day**. Did you know, India started a movement to protect house sparrows!



21 It's **World Forestry Day**. The date was chosen because it marks the summer equinox, symbolising balance and renewal.



22 It's **World Water Day**. Did you know, India has over 3,00,000 stepwells, many still undiscovered.



23 Today is **Shaheed Diwas**, a day that is observed in honour of Bhagat Singh, Rajguru and Sukhdev, who were martyred on this day in 1931.



24 The Silent Valley in Kerala is one of the last untouched rainforests in Asia.



25 Sound travels four times faster in water than in air, because the molecules are packed closer together.



26 Mercury is only slightly larger than Earth's moon. Where Mercury's diameter is about 4,880kms, the moon's is approximately 3,474kms.



27 The world's deepest post-box sits underwater in Japan. It is located in Susami Bay and divers post waterproof cards there.



28 The Khasi tribe of Meghalaya follows matrilineal inheritance—surnames go from mother to child.



29 Most of the universe is invisible. About 95% is dark matter and dark energy.



30 Coconut water and blood plasma share surprisingly similar chemistry.



31 The Indian roller bird has six shades of blue on its wings.
